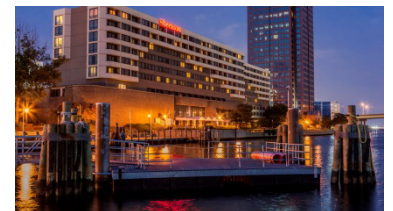

WELCOME to Norfolk, VA, home to the world's largest Naval Base, General MacArthur Memorial and the world's last and largest Battleship, the Battleship Wisconsin. Average temperatures will be pleasant (positive thinking!), highs in the mid 70's and lows in the high 50's, so bring an evening jacket. It will be perfect weather for a perfect Reunion!

The 30<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL REUNION will be held **Thursday, October 4 through Sunday, October 7, 2018** (back to our normal meeting days but with a slightly different program) at the *Sheraton Norfolk Waterside Hotel* (and, "Waterside" is true, right on the Elizabeth River), the only Hotel in Norfolk located directly on the water, located at 777 Waterside Dr., Norfolk, VA 23510. The Hotel underwent a total renovation in 2017 so



they are quite anxious to show it off, new lobby, new sleeping rooms, new meeting rooms! Looking for a good steak/seafood dinner, try the Waterside Seafood Co. inside the Hotel, open 6 am to 10 pm daily. The revitalized “Waterside District”, next door to the Hotel, re-opened with exciting eateries, a beer garden and live entertainment. You will find a variety of restaurants, i.e., Blue Moon Taphouse, Guy Fieri’s Smokehouse, Chipotle, The Harbor Club, Stripers Waterside, Rocky Mountain Grill, Norfolk Coffee & Tea, Vin Wine Bar, The Fudgery and many others. Be sure to check it out! You won’t go hungry!!

OKAY.....Let’s get right to the DETAILS, DETAILS, and DETAILS...Call the Hotel TODAY!! **Call the Sheraton Norfolk Waterside Hotel at 800-325-3535 to book your room** and remember to tell them you are with the USS Lyman K. Swenson Reunion to ensure you receive our room rates. The sooner you call the easier it is to make sure we get everyone in a room. We can only block a few rooms for early arrivals and late departures, so call today and be guaranteed a room at our fabulous, unbelievable rate of **\$109.00 per night plus tax!** If you wish to upgrade your room to a balcony room the rate is only \$119.00. This is a real bargain for a Hotel on the water! For this rate you will receive complimentary high speed internet, reduced self-parking rate of \$8.00 per day, 15% discount at the Waterside Seafood Co. Restaurant, and, all rooms do have coffee makers and a refrigerator.

Don’t be left out. **DEADLINE FOR HOTEL RESERVATIONS: THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 6, 2018.** NOTE: When you call 800-325-3535 to book your room, if they have already sold our small block for early arrivals and late departures, don’t fret, they will advise you the hotel is sold out for those dates, go ahead and book the normal dates, Thursday – Sunday, then call the hotel direct at 757-622-6664 or call me, Daisy, at 775-530-4536. I will contact the hotel, get you booked and have them release more rooms for early/late use. It’s a pain, but when you are dealing with “central reservations” that is the way it works. **COME EARLY & STAY LATE**, we’ll get you in and guarantee you will have more than enough to keep you busy!

**For our computer savvy folks**, you can book your room on-line via a personalized Web site created for us. You can access the site to learn more about the event and to book, modify or cancel a reservation from May 1, 2018 to October 9, 2018. But, remember, if you want our room rates the deadline to book a room is Thursday, September 6, 2018. Here is the appropriate link to access the site:

**TRANSPORTATION:** If arriving by plane, Norfolk International Airport (ORF) is approximately 7 miles from the Hotel and the Hotel DOES NOT have airport shuttle service. They have shuttle service for local, downtown and Amtrak use only. However, you can make reservations with James River Transportation Company at 866-823-4626. Cost is \$30.00 or \$35.40 w/gratuity each way for a sedan with up to 3 people, and \$55.00 or \$65.00 w/gratuity each way for a van for 4 to 9 people. Or taxi cab service is approximately \$20 to \$30 each way. Or for those who are familiar, you can hire UBER.

If arriving by Amtrak, the Amtrak Station is located at Harbor Park. The Hotel DOES provide complimentary shuttle service to and from the Amtrak Station. Contact the Hotel at 757-622-6664 for shuttle reservations.

If driving, again, we are downtown and parking is at a premium. Parking is available at the Dominion Tower Parking Garage adjacent to the Hotel. Normal rates are \$13.00 per day but the hotel will provide

self-parking vouchers at check-in for \$8.00 per day. Valet parking is \$26.00 per night. Anyone displaying a disabled parking tag may park in the valet lot at the self-parking rate of \$8.00 per day.

**From East** – Take Interstate 64 East toward Richmond. Continue to I-264 West and take Exit 284A (toward Norfolk). Follow Exit 9 to Waterside Drive (exit left). Turn left at the first traffic light. Guest check in and valet parking is to your right.

**From North** – Take Interstate 95 South toward Richmond. Just before Richmond, take Interstate 295 South (toward Norfolk, Virginia Beach). Bypass Richmond, then merge onto Interstate 64 East. Continue to Interstate 264 West and take Exit 284A (toward Norfolk). Follow Exit 9 to Waterside Drive (left exit). Turn left at the first traffic light. Guest check in and valet parking is to your right.

**From West** – Take Route 58 East (toward Norfolk). Follow 58 East to Interstate 264 East (toward Norfolk). Go through the downtown tunnel and over the bridge. Follow Exit 9 (left exit) to Waterside Drive exit. Turn left at the first traffic light. Guest check in and valet parking is to your right.

**From South** – Take Interstate 95 North to Route 58 East (toward Norfolk). Follow Route 58 East to I-264 East (toward Norfolk). Go through the downtown tunnel and over the bridge. Follow Exit 9 (left exit) to Waterside Drive exit. Turn left at the first traffic light. Guest check in and valet parking is to your right.

*(Bridges, bridges, bridges...Anyone interested in how to get there with the least amount and the least scariest bridges and tunnels...other than flying, of course,...If you are driving....Just call Daisy or Gregg Smoyer...he had to route her around every bridge and tunnel except the least scariest ones when they visited...and it worked!!! Took a little longer, but it worked! Just call Daisy and ask her!)*

And, what a Special Event it will be! We will be boarding early at 5:15 pm for a Private Party one hour before public boarding...the “cash bar”



will be open (sorry, you are on your own for drinks) and Special Entertainment will be joining us...the one, the only... **“Frank Sinatra”!** Yes, **“Frank Sings Frank...The Best is Yet to Come”** will perform from 5:15 to 6:15 pm with dancing! You don’t want to miss this entertainment. “Frank” is wonderful and will bring back many great memories! Frank and his wife, Cindy, will also join us for the dinner cruise following his performance so there will be lots of time for pictures and visiting.

We will board at 5:15 pm prior to the general public boarding at 6:30 pm. The “all you can eat” dinner buffet will open at 6:30 pm and what a dinner it will be! Your entrees will include Oven Baked Atlantic Cod Filet, Honey & Sesame Chicken, Whole Roasted Pork Loin, Braised Beef Short Ribs, numerous salads, vegetables and pasta, not to mention desserts! Dinner does include coffee, tea or water and the cash bar will remain open. The Cruise will be of the beautiful Norfolk area during sunset from 7:00 to 9:00 pm and will give you the opportunity to dine, dance to the music of the DJ from Astro Entertainment (yes, he takes requests) beginning at 6:30 pm and play games (yes, shuffle board, giant jenga, foosball, etc.).

During our Cruise, you can catch a preliminary view of the mighty ships and submarines of the Navy’s Atlantic Fleet. We will cruise the Elizabeth River by the Nauticus, Old Fort Norfolk, Norfolk Southern Coal Terminals, Tanner’s Point, Norfolk Naval Base/Atlantic Fleet, Merrimac Battle Site, Portsmouth Marine Terminal, Portsmouth Naval Hospital, and more.

Oh My...there must be a catch....The **“SPIRIT OF NORFOLK DINNER CRUISE”** suggests **appropriate attire as Business Casual**. Yes, recommendation for men’s attire includes slacks, and a polo or button down shirts and for women, slacks, Capri pants or sundress. They strongly discourage T-shirts, jeans, shorts or athletic footwear. So leave your jeans & shorts for Friday’s tours.

One more “minor” catch....what, no buses....that’s right, no buses. The Cruise Ship is docked just .02 mile from our Hotel, a beautiful stroll along the Elizabeth River, approximately a 6 minute walk. In order to keep this excursion at an affordable cost, we eliminated the buses. This is an easy walk and we will allow everyone plenty of time to get to the ship. However, we know there are some that will not be able to walk it and that’s okay. We will get you there. We just need to know, in advance, and we will arrange shuttle transportation. The Hotel does have shuttle service based on availability. Just give me, Daisy, a call at 775-530-4536 so I know how many people I need to transport and I will make the necessary arrangements. Yes, electric scooters and wheel chairs can go aboard. The ship is ADA accessible on the lower level only, not on decks 2 and 3. It will all work out fine and we will all have a wonderful time. Just remember, if you don’t think you can make the walk, let us know in advance. (Your doctors are going to love me; even if you don’t think so...walking is the best exercise!)

We will meet in the Lobby of the Hotel at 4:45 pm and proceed to the Ship, walkers one way, and those for shuttle will board the shuttle bus. AND, the return to the Hotel, at 9:00 pm, will be the same, walkers walk and riders will ride. AND, YES, the Hospitality Room will be open upon our return! This will be a night to remember...just like the past 30 years!!...not to mention the years aboard the Swenson!!!

**FRIDAY**....After a good night’s sleep, and I know you will sleep good after a beautiful sunset dinner cruise and a lovely evening stroll, we will meet for a **Continental Breakfast** and **All Hands Meeting** from 8:00 to 10:00 am. Following the meeting, we will meet in the Hotel Lobby at 10:15 am, and, once again, we will be taking another short “stroll” along the Elizabeth River! YES, we will be walking and depart for the **“VICTORY ROVER NAVAL BASE CRUISE”**, just a short distance further than Thursday night’s “stroll”, past the “Spirit





of Norfolk”. The distance is 0.4 miles and approximately an 8 minute walk. We will be **BACK ON THE WATER!!** This is the Navy, right?!! AND, YEA!, the dress today is casual....so be sure to wear your new Swenson T-shirt! Again, the same requirements will apply for this trip as for Thursday nights’ cruise as far as getting back and forth to the boat...if you needed assistance with transportation Thursday night, instead of walking, we will arrange a shuttle for you.

The “**VICTORY ROVER NAVAL BASE CRUISE**” is from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm and includes a box lunch (indicate your choice of sandwiches on the Registration Form). We will board the boat at 10:45 am for an 11:00 am departure. **DO NOT BE LATE. The boat will not wait for anyone...it will leave at 11:00 am with or without you!!!** NOTE: Those with electric scooters....you can utilize your scooters to get to the boat, however, it is not equipped, nor has the room, to allow them access onboard. We will assist you on board and your scooter will remain secured at dockside. Wheel chairs are okay on board.

This will be another cruise you will always remember. The Captains are very knowledgeable about all the ships in port and will get you up close and personal as we cruise through the bustling Hampton Roads Harbor, one of the largest in the world.

You will see aircraft carriers, nuclear submarines, guided cruisers (hopefully a destroyer or two) and all of the other ships that form the world’s most powerful armada. Enjoy fascinating and entertaining commentary during the 2 hour cruise.

Following the cruise and lunch, we will disembark at 1:00 pm and walk next door to the “**BATTLESHIP WISCONSIN**” where we will conduct our **Memorial Service** on the fantail of the world’s largest Battleship. Stand beneath her 16 inch guns and feel the excitement of being aboard an historic Warship! WOW! Stay close. If you get lost on this Battleship you may be lost for a long time! She’s huge!!!

Speaking of **Memorial Services**...this will be another special service. However, to make it that way, our Chaplain, Mike Fulks, needs volunteers! Step up to the plate and email Mike at [Chaplain@DD729.com](mailto:Chaplain@DD729.com) and let him know you are available and volunteer to help with the flag detail, bell ringer, etc. It’s not every day we have the opportunity to conduct a Memorial Service onboard the world’s largest Battleship, so let’s make it the best one yet. Contact Mike today to volunteer so we can finalize all our plans.



Following the Memorial Service you will have the opportunity to tour and explore, at your own pace, the “**BATTLESHIP WISCONSIN**”, one of the famous Iowa-class ships, weighing in at 45,000 tons and measuring in at 887 feet long, this “City at Sea” has gained official status on the National Register of Historic places. During her heyday, the *Wisconsin* served in 3 wars and earned 6 battle stars in action while carrying 3,000 men during WWII. You can also journey through the world’s oceans at “**NAUTICUS, THE NATIONAL MARITIME CENTER**”. “**NAUTICUS**” is an interactive science and technology center, exploring the power of the sea, which many of you know, maybe all too well! Also housed here is the **Hampton Roads Naval Museum**, one of ten museums officially operated by the U.S. Navy, highlighting navy battles and exhibits of detailed ship models, artwork and memorabilia. Both venues close at 5:00 pm, so take your time. **WE WILL NOT** be taking a head count to go back to the Hotel. You are on your own, unless you need transportation, at which time you can locate Daisy at 4:00 pm at the entrance to the museums. If walking, when you are ready to depart, you can make your own way back to the Hotel along the river walk, or if you are hungry, you can stop in at “Waterside” and take in one of many fine seafood or specialty restaurants. Or go back to the Hotel and have a wonderful dinner at the

Waterside Seafood Co. Restaurant. (Be sure to check out the **Lone Sailor Statue** alongside the *Wisconsin* in Town Point Park)

Enjoy your evening, and, of course, join everyone later in the Hospitality Room for more camaraderie. Whew....what a day! Are we water logged yet? Well for Saturday we will stay on land! Unless, of course, you choose to venture out on your own and take in a few more boat rides – we are on the water!

**SATURDAY – OPTIONAL TOUR** - Enjoy a leisurely breakfast on your own, and if interested, join us on our optional SATURDAY TOUR. This tour is **LIMITED to 50 PEOPLE ONLY!** So, first come, first serve. Sign up **EARLY!** **COST is ONLY \$59.00 per person** and is well worth it. We will board the buses at 9:15 am and depart the Hotel at 9:30 am to enjoy a **NORFOLK CITY TOUR**, one of which many will remember if you were ever stationed at Norfolk, but now with a lovely historic district and restored areas. (Do you think they still have the signs posted on the courthouse lawns, **“Dogs and Sailors Keep Off the Grass”**?)!!!

On the City Tour we will view stately homes, the Chrysler Museum of Art, the restored waterfront and many other points of interest. We will stop and visit the **MACARTHUR MEMORIAL** for a glimpse into our country’s history. View a short film which chronicles five star General MacArthur’s life, trace his life through the outstanding collections and visit the rotunda where the General and Mrs. MacArthur are entombed. And, of course, don’t forget the Gift Shop.



Next we will head to **FREEMASON ABBEY** for lunch, housed in a 140-year old renovated church. This has been a local’s favorite for more than 30 years and is reminiscent of English style pub houses with a warm, casual yet elegant tavern atmosphere. Our final stop, after lunch for a light dessert, will be **DOUMAR’S**, home of the world’s first ice cream cone machine. Abe Doumar created the 1<sup>st</sup> ice cream cone at the World’s Fair in 1904 in St. Louis. They still bake cones on the original cone machine.

Everyone will be given an introduction and history and treated to an ice cream and cone. We will return to the Hotel by 2:00 pm, plenty of time to relax and enjoy more time in the Hospitality Room prior to our Saturday evening festivities.
